- To amend the Help America Vote Act of 2002 to establish certain photo identification requirements for voting in District of Columbia elections and to require proof of citizenship to register to vote in District of Columbia elections, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "American Confidence
5 in Elections: District of Columbia Voter Identification
6 Act".

1	SEC. 2. REQUIREMENTS FOR PHOTO IDENTIFICATION AND
2	PROOF OF CITIZENSHIP WITH RESPECT TO
3	DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA ELECTIONS.
4	(a) REQUIREMENTS.—Title III of the Help America
5	Vote Act of 2002 (52 U.S.C. 21081 et seq.) is amended—
6	(1) by redesignating sections 304 and 305 as
7	sections 306 and 307, respectively; and
8	(2) by inserting after section 303 the following
9	new sections:
10	"SEC. 304. REQUIREMENTS FOR PHOTO IDENTIFICATION IN
11	DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA ELECTIONS.
12	"(a) Requiring Provision of Identification to
13	RECEIVE A BALLOT OR VOTE.—
14	"(1) Individuals voting in person.—A Dis-
15	trict of Columbia election official may not provide a
16	ballot for a District of Columbia election to an indi-
17	vidual who desires to vote in person unless the indi-
18	vidual presents to the official an identification de-
19	scribed in paragraph (3).
20	"(2) Individuals voting other than in
21	PERSON.—A District of Columbia election official
22	may not provide a ballot for a District of Columbia
23	election to an individual who desires to vote other
24	than in person unless the individual submits with
25	the application for the ballot a copy of an identifica-
26	tion described in paragraph (3).

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"(3) IDENTIFICATION DESCRIBED.—An identi fication described in this paragraph is, with respect
 to an individual, any of the following:
 "(A) A current and valid motor vehicle li cense issued by the District of Columbia or any

other current and valid photo identification of the individual which is issued by the District of Columbia or the identification number for such motor vehicle license or photo identification.

"(B) A current and valid United States
passport, a current and valid military photo
identification, or any other current and valid
photo identification of the individual which is
issued by the Federal government.

15 "(C) Any current and valid photo identi16 fication of the individual which is issued by a
17 Tribal Government.

"(D) A student photo identification issued
by a secondary school (as such term is defined
in section 8101 of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C.
7801)) or an institution of higher education (as
such term is defined in section 101 of the Higher Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 1001)).

"(E) The last 4 digits of the individual's
 social security number.

3 "(4) Ensuring proof of residence.—If an 4 individual presents or submits an identification de-5 scribed in paragraph (3) which does not include the address of the individual's residence, the District of 6 7 Columbia election official may not provide a ballot to the individual unless the individual presents or sub-8 9 mits a document or other written information from 10 a third party which— "(A) provides the address of the individ-11 12 ual's residence; and 13 "(B) such document or other written infor-14 mation is of sufficient validity such that the

16 identity of the individual.

"(b) PROVISION OF IDENTIFICATION WITHOUT COST
TO INDIGENT INDIVIDUALS.—If the District of Columbia
charges an individual a fee for an identification described
in subsection (a)(3) and the individual provides an attestation that the individual is unable to afford the fee, the
District of Columbia shall provide the identification to the
individual at no cost.

24 "(c) SPECIAL RULE WITH RESPECT TO SINCERELY
25 HELD RELIGIOUS BELIEFS.—In the case of an individual

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1 who is unable to comply with the requirements of sub2 section (a) due to sincerely held religious beliefs, the Dis3 trict of Columbia shall provide such individual with an al4 ternative identification that shall be deemed to meet the
5 requirements of an identification described in subsection
6 (a)(3).

"(d) DESIGNATION OF DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA
AGENCY TO PROVIDE COPIES OF IDENTIFICATION.—The
Mayor of the District of Columbia shall designate an agency of the District of Columbia government to provide an
individual with a copy of an identification described in
subsection (a)(3) at no cost to the individual for the purposes of meeting the requirement under subsection (a)(2).

14 "(e) INCLUSION OF PHOTOS IN POLL BOOKS.—

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- "(1) Methods for obtaining photos.—
- 16 "(A) PROVISION OF PHOTOS BY OFFICES 17 OF DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA GOVERNMENT.-If 18 any office of the District of Columbia govern-19 ment has a photograph or digital image of the 20 likeness of an individual who is eligible to vote 21 in a District of Columbia election, the office, in 22 consultation with the chief election official of 23 the District of Columbia, shall provide access to 24 the photograph or digital image to the chief 25 election official of the District of Columbia.

1 "(B) TAKING OF PHOTOS AT POLLING 2 PLACE.—If a photograph or digital image of an 3 individual who votes in person at a polling place 4 is not included in the poll book which contains 5 the name of the individuals who are eligible to 6 vote in the District of Columbia election and 7 which is used by election officials to provide 8 ballots to such eligible individuals, the appro-9 priate election official shall take a photograph 10 of the individual and provide access to the pho-11 tograph to the chief election official of the Dis-12 trict of Columbia.

"(C) COPIES OF PHOTOS PROVIDED BY IN-13 14 DIVIDUALS NOT VOTING IN PERSON.—The elec-15 tion official who receives a copy of an identifica-16 tion described in subsection (a)(3) which is sub-17 mitted by an individual who desires to vote 18 other than in person at a polling place shall 19 provide access to the copy of the identification 20 to the chief election official of the District of 21 Columbia.

"(2) INCLUSION IN POLL BOOKS.—The chief
election official of the District of Columbia shall ensure that a photograph, digital image, or copy of an
identification for which access is provided under

paragraph (1) is included in the poll book which con tains the name of the individuals who are eligible to
 vote in the District of Columbia election and which
 is used by election officials to provide ballots to such
 eligible individuals.

6 "(3) PROTECTION OF PRIVACY OF VOTERS.— 7 The appropriate election officials of the District of 8 Columbia shall ensure that any photograph, digital 9 image, or copy of an identification which is included 10 in a poll book under this subsection is not used for 11 any purpose other than the administration of Dis-12 trict of Columbia elections and is not provided or otherwise made available to any other person except 13 14 as may be necessary to carry out that purpose.

15 "(f) EXCEPTIONS.—This section does not apply with16 respect to any individual who is—

17 "(1) entitled to vote by absentee ballot under
18 the Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee Vot19 ing Act (52 U.S.C. 20301 et seq.);

"(2) provided the right to vote otherwise than
in person under section 3(b)(2)(B)(ii) of the Voting
Accessibility for the Elderly and Handicapped Act
(52 U.S.C. 20102(b)(2)(B)(ii)); or

24 "(3) entitled to vote otherwise than in person25 under any other Federal law.

"(g) DEFINITIONS.—For the purposes of this section,
 the following definitions apply:

3 "(1) DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA ELECTION.—The
4 term 'District of Columbia election' means any elec5 tion for public office in the District of Columbia, in6 cluding an election for Federal office, and any ballot
7 initiative or referendum.

8 "(2) INDIAN TRIBE.—The term 'Indian Tribe' 9 has the meaning given the term 'Indian tribe' in sec-10 tion 4 of the Indian Self-Determination and Edu-11 cation Assistance Act (25 U.S.C. 5304).

12 "(3) TRIBAL GOVERNMENT.—The term 'Tribal
13 Government' means the recognized governing body
14 of an Indian Tribe.

15 "SEC. 305. REQUIRING PROOF OF UNITED STATES CITIZEN-16 SHIP TO REGISTER TO VOTE IN A DISTRICT

17 **OF COLUMBIA ELECTION.**

18 "(a) IN GENERAL.—An individual may not register 19 to vote in a District of Columbia election unless, at the 20 time the individual applies to register to vote, the indi-21 vidual provides documentary proof that the individual is 22 a citizen of the United States.

23 "(b) DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA ELECTION DEFINED.—
24 In this section, the term 'District of Columbia election'
25 means any election for public office in the District of Co-

lumbia, including an election for Federal office, and any
 ballot initiative or referendum.".

3 (b) CONFORMING AMENDMENT RELATING TO EN4 FORCEMENT.—Section 401 of the Help America Vote Act
5 of 2002 (52 U.S.C. 21111) is amended by striking "and
6 303" and inserting "303, 304, and 305".

7 (c) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of contents8 of such Act is amended—

9 (1) by redesignating the items relating to sec10 tions 304 and 305 as relating to sections 306 and
11 307, respectively; and

12 (2) by inserting after the item relating to sec-

13 tion 303 the following new items:

"Sec. 304. Requirements for photo identification in District of Columbia elections.

"Sec. 305. Requiring proof of United States citizenship to register to vote in a District of Columbia election.".
